MOMENT TO PONDER

Again today we hear from the story of the biblical exodus. For us, moving from one place to another in our personal and church lives, exodus is a metaphor, a story that connects with parts of what we are seeing and feeling. We know from events of this summer that exodus is less a metaphor than a reality for many. Hundreds fled wildfires this summer, moving from place to place. Many found they had no home to return to. This week the world heard that 65,000 Armenian residents of Nagoro-Karabakh (an island in the nation of Azerbaijan) were fleeing their homes and did not know where they were going. If that were not enough, the southern United States is bracing for greater pressure from refugees coming to its Mexican border.

The fears of homelessness, hunger, and uncertainty are all too real for many in our world.

Likewise, for many, shortage of clean drinkable water is more than a metaphor. Anyone who travels, plans to carry enough water for immediate needs if they can. Yet droughts for crops, livestock and people are becoming more prevalent.

Metaphor is a powerful way to understand and use our experience. Let us not forget those for whom the metaphor is all too real and all too devastating.
