Statement of Living Faith Story

In 2020 Immanuel United Church had to recognize that changing times, notable decline in financial and human resources made it clear we needed to Look Ahead and find a new way of being the church. Part of this journey includes reaching out to our neighbourhood United Churches, and part was to find a minister with the qualities we need to guide us along the unknown pathways into the future. We did our soul searching and praying. We put out the call for help using these words describing who we hoped to find:

We are looking for a minister, rooted in liberal theology and social justice; one who offers strong worship leadership with story-telling skills which provide wisdom and strength in challenging and changing times. He/she trusts the wisdom of the lay leadership of the congregation and works in partnership with the church staff, recognizing that we are all in this ministry together. He/she extends a compassionate and inclusive welcome to all.

We at Immanuel were privileged to have made Rev Paul DuVal's acquaintance last year when he agreed to share ministry between us and Fort Garry United. We got to know each other and found out how very well Paul answered our prayers. Needless to say we were all thrilled when Paul threw his hat into the ring for this year's one year supply ministry here.

You see Paul is rooted in liberal theology and social justice. This is evident in the very hymns he so thoughtfully chooses each week to highlight the succinct and inspiring worship services he gives us. He skillfully weaves bible stories in and out of current affairs mixed with his own stories so that one usually comes away feeling fulfilled and

more at peace than when one came to worship. He is more than respectful of staff and lay leadership, he is supportive and thoughtful. Paul is a kind and compassionate man. Where he truly shines, however is in the myriad ways he leads us into facing and dealing with the inevitable changes to come in our church. Paul actively, willingly takes part in all of our "Looking Ahead" meetings and gatherings and offers his wisdom rooted in experience in many helpful ways. Using scripture and prayers each Sunday he connects our challenges and the changes we face with similar biblical events thereby consoling and guiding us all at once.
