#### **MOMENT TO PONDER:**

Most years, thousands of Christians would be travelling to the Holy Land to celebrate Christmas in Bethlehem. This year there are no decorations, no celebrations, Christmas in Bethlehem is cancelled. The minister of the Lutheran Church in Bethlehem said, "If Jesus was born today, he would be born in Gaza under the rubble."

Bethlehem is under siege, part of the Gazan war.

If Christmas cannot come to Bethlehem this year, perhaps it is up to us to hold Christmas a little more deliberately; gently, quietly, hopefully; On behalf of all those who can't hold Christmas this year. We could hold Christmas on behalf of those in our own community who are estranged, those who are in prison, those who are grieving. But we can also hold Christmas on behalf of Palestinian Christians, and say a prayer for the families of Israeli dead and those who are hostages, for Muslim children. Christmas can be a time of celebration, it can also be a time of compassion, determination, love, even when there is little Peace.
